Questions and Answers for Candidates

What is the difference between VeriSM™ Foundation, *Essentials* and *Plus*?

The Foundation training and exam covers both the *Essentials* content and the *Plus* content. VeriSM™ *Essentials* covers basic service management principles. VeriSM™ *Plus* covers progressive technologies and practices and how they relate to service management. If you already have an IT service management certificate you can skip the *Essentials* part and do only VeriSM™ *Plus*.

What are the options when I want to become VeriSM™ Foundation certified?

There are multiple paths you can follow to become certified on a foundation level.

1. The first option is successful completion of the VeriSM™ Foundation exam.
2. When you already have an IT service management certificate, successful completion of the VeriSM™ *Plus* exam will lead to the VeriSM™ Foundation certificate. The Foundation certificate will be generated automatically when you meet the requirements.
3. You may decide to do the VeriSM™ *Essentials* exam and the VeriSM™ *Plus* exams in different time frames. The moment you successfully completed both exams you receive the VeriSM™ Foundation certificate. The Foundation certificate will be generated automatically when you meet the requirements.

Will I receive a certificate when I pass the VeriSM™ *Essentials* exam?

Yes, you will receive the VeriSM™ *Essentials* certificate.

Will I receive a certificate when I pass the VeriSM™ *Plus* exam?

When you also uploaded another IT service management certificate (for example ITIL, IT service management based on ISO/IEC 20000 or VeriSM™ *Essentials*) you will receive the VeriSM™ Foundation certificate.

You can do the VeriSM™ *Plus* exam without having one of these certificates. You will not receive a certificate at that moment. You will receive a result paper though.

I have an ITIL certificate, why do I need another IT service management certificate?

VeriSM™ is not an IT service management framework, it is a service management approach for the digital age. Businesses are running mainly digitally nowadays and VeriSM™ prepares you for supporting the

digital services, end to end, with all teams, from the consumer needs to service fulfillment. Moreover VeriSM™ points to evolving technologies and progressive management practices. ITIL is one of the practices that contribute to the overall value adding activities.

Will I get a VeriSM™ certificate or an EXIN certificate?

After passing a VeriSM™ exam at EXIN, you will receive an EXIN certificate with the VeriSM™ and IFDC logo's on it.

Are there any pre-requisites I have to meet before I can take a VeriSM™ exam?

No, the exams can be done without meeting any specific pre-requisites. Although attending an accredited training is recommended.

Where can I do a VeriSM™ exam?

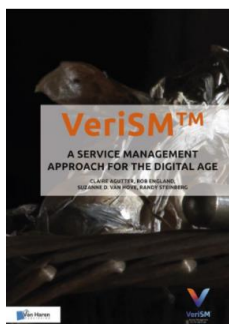
You can usually do a VeriSM™ exam at an Accredited Training Organization (ATO) who offers the VeriSM™ training and exams, or you can use [EXIN Anywhere](#).

Is training mandatory for the VeriSM™ exam(s)?

No, training is not mandatory. EXIN recommends to follow a training though prior to taking the exam. You can find a list of accredited training organizations at www.exin.com.

What are the trainer requirements for the VeriSM™ modules?

In general: To become accredited as a trainer for the VeriSM™ modules, the trainer needs to hold the relevant VeriSM™ Certification for the course they intend to train.

For offering VeriSM™ *Essentials* and VeriSM™ *Plus* the trainer needs to hold the VeriSM™ Foundation certificate.
